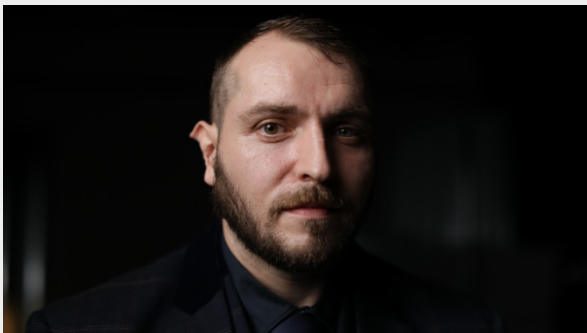

The second episode of the hard-hitting documentary series reveals the truth about life behind bars in Wormwood Scrubs, one of Britain's most infamous jails.

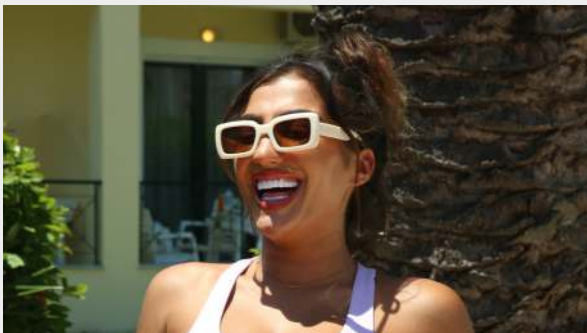

Jill Douglas presents the World Grand Prix from Cheltenham - as players go head to head in the first of three tournaments that make up the Cazoo Series.

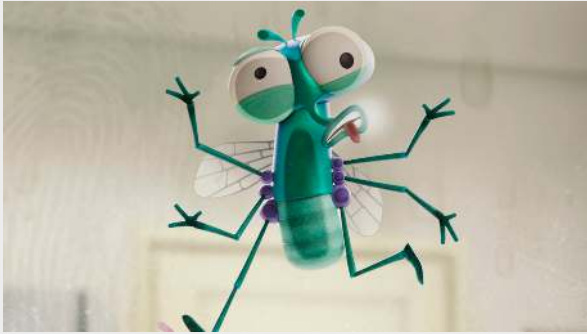
